Vocation Update

Everyone who is involved in vocation work knows that success cannot be defined by numbers but by relationships. Most inquirers into religious life do not respond to emails, phone calls, mailings, etc. Among those who do respond, the number who actually participate in a 'Come and See' weekend are small. This could easily be a gloom and doom scenario and yet there are a lot of hopeful trends for the Province.

First of all, we have more than twenty men who are in conversation with the Province about their vocation. What I said earlier about relationships is particularly important to serious discerners; the more we reach out to them, the more they respond. As we all know, in the space of fifty years things have changed dramatically where vocations to religious life are concerned. There are many options in life that are available to most people and forming good relationships with those in discernment can often make the difference for them as they struggle to know and follow God's will.

Second, about half of our inquirers are under the age of thirty, which is in line with national trends for most men's religious communities. The very fact that younger people would even consider religious life as a valid, life-giving option for them is extremely encouraging.

Last of all, we do have two men who are in the application process right now, Andrew-Paul Harrison and David Ratliff. There will most likely be at least one other person applying as well. Our next Discernment Weekend at San Pedro will take place in December, 2-4 and four men have already registered for it. May God continue to bless us with good and holy brothers.

A Final Word

Just as the sun rises over the world in God's heaven, so friars must let their light shine before all people so that they may see their good deeds and give praise to their heavenly Father. They have been placed here to care for others. Their own lives should be an example to others, showing how they must live in the house of the Lord.
